COACHES' MENTORING CHALLENGE EXPANDS TO KANSAS, NEBRASKA AND IOWA

Football Coaches Challenge Each Other To See Which State Can Recruit More Mentors

For the past three years Kansas State University's head football coach, Bill Snyder, and Nebraska's former head football coach, Tom Osborne, have engaged in a friendly wager to see which state, Kansas or Nebraska, could recruit the most new mentors during the football season. Last year, Kansas University's head football coach, Turner Gill joined team Kansas and raising the stakes for the 2011 Coaches' Challenge, the state of Iowa is throwing their hat in the ring – making this year a three state competition between Kansas, Nebraska and Iowa!

“Both on and off the football field, caring role models are making a tremendous difference in the lives of our young people,” Snyder said. “That is why I ask every Kansan to join me in this Challenge by signing up to mentor a young person today.”

The 2011 Coaches' Challenge runs from August 1 to November 21. The winning team will be announced on December 2, 2011 at the Kansas State/Iowa State Game in Manhattan, KS. Last year, Kansas was crowned the winner for a third year in a row, recruiting over 4,000 new mentors and yet there is still a need for more adult role models!

Currently there are thousands of young Kansans, especially young males, in need of a caring role model. In as little as an hour a week, an individual can offer the support and guidance these young people need to succeed.
